faces on the front cover of the newspaper. Youth and adults from Tiffin, Bellevue, Attica, and New Riegel visited Congressman Latta as part of our Pilgrimage for Life in Washington D.C. last week. After a ten-hour bus ride, we arrived Thursday morning for Mass at St. Matthew Cathedral, then walked several blocks to the Mall between the Washington monument and the Capital Building where we began our official March for Life through the heart of the city to the Supreme Court, where the unjust decision of Roe v. Wade first permitted the murder of children thirty-six years ago. After a visit with Congressman Latta, we spent the night in simple youth hostels, toured some museums the next morning, and ended with Mass at the National Basilica of the Immaculate Conception before beginning the long drive home.

Sadly, the 300,000 demonstrators made no apparent impact on President Obama, who immediately assigned our federal tax dollars to fund abortions in foreign countries. More disturbing is the looming FOCA Bill in Congress, which the president has promised to sign, and which would require all hospitals to provide abortions. This would close all Catholic health care in the United States, since any hospital who agreed to these measures would forfeit its Catholic affiliation.

We need immediate action to show our lawmakers that we deplore this course of action. Please take the postcards provided in church and send them to your representatives to protect innocent human life.
